#1. Ratio Change

F irst on the list of alternative options is changing the aspect ratio of the rendering. Here, the camera angle stays the same as in the main 3D picture, but the proportions of the image are changed from horizontal to vertical. Such imagery is perfect for social media platforms like Instagram or for mobile versions of the designer's portfolio. additional views for the interior 3D visualization you can get at a discount!



#2. Camera Angle Change

W ith the whole interior scene already built in 3D,

a CG artist can easily move the camera to render a new image.

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The subtle shift in perspective shown in the picture above ensures that three walls of the room are visible at once. As a result, this rendering provides a viewer with a clearer idea of how different details of the interior design come together to create a cohesive and comfortable living space.



#3. Opposite View

M oving the camera in the opposite direction can give viewers an even deeper understanding of the interior layout. Combined with the initial CG picture, these rendering options will demonstrate the proportions of the whole space and convey the essence of the project.



#4. Alternative Layout

N ext on the list of interior rendering options is the room layout variation. Here, the camera position is the same as in the main view but the furniture and decor are rearranged. This rendering can help demonstrate how different interior setups would look.



#5. Zoom Out

A slight zoom-out gives a wider viewing angle to the rendering. These visualization options can help showcase a larger portion of the interior. As a result, they can provide a better grasp of the spatial relationships of design elements in the room.

#6. Zoom In

Besides backing away, a camera can be positioned closer to a particular area of the 3D scene. Utilizing this zoom feature results in a rendering that focuses on a certain part of the interior, providing a closer look at design elements, textures, and materials.





#7. Furniture Change

t's also possible to replace the furniture models with different ones. This option gives the ability to experiment with various design concepts and ideas that can be implemented in the interior. On top of that, it provides viewers with a better understanding of the functionality of the space. #8. Decor Change

S imilarly to the previous solution, the same can be done with the decor elements. Exterior CGI for an Oceanfront Estate in Carmel, California

<u>Sterling-Huddleson Architecture</u> is a diverse design firm dedicated to thoughtfully executed design solutions. They are based in California and have over twenty years of experience. Braden Sterling, the company's principal, first reached out to our <u>architectural visualization studio</u> in 2017 to commission a number of 3D renderings to further study architectural design and client



visualization. Since then, we've completed 14 projects together,

and are eager to continue our partnership.



In this case study, you will discover the details of our workflow and see the results of our latest 3D rendering project done for Sterling-Huddleson. It involved creating marketing CGI for the most expensive home in Carmel, California. Want to know more? Let's dive in!

#1. Scope of Work and References

n the course of this collaboration with the architectural firm, we made exterior CGI for a luxurious residence off the coast of the Pacific Ocean. Our client needed real estate marketing CG visuals showing the future look of the stunning property that was under construction at the time.

In total, we created 4 exterior 3D views:

• an eye-level rendering of the entry side of the building, as it would be seen from the driveway;

• a 3D rendering of the rooftop terrace with an ocean view;

• renders showing the rear and left sides of the estate.

The final resolution of the CG visuals had to be 5K, 300 dpi.

Braden provided us with an extensive package of references for the task:

• drawings in the DWG format;

exterior materials references;

• inspiration pictures for the rooftop terrace;

• drone footage of the construction site:

• Google Maps location of the estate.

All real estate visualizations, except for the entry side view, were





created using the photo matching technique. That means our CG artist combined a realistic 3D model of the property with drone photos of the construction site. This approach allowed us to save the client's time and reduce the cost of work, as there was no need to create a virtual environment around the property from scratch.






